A-G REQUIREMENTS CSU

Learners must complete the following requirements with a "C-" or higher

- A. HISTORY 1 2 1 /2 1/2 year US History, 1 year US History OR 1/2 year US History and 1/2 year Government
- B. ENGLISH 1) 2 3 4 4 Years of College Prep English
- C. MATH 10 2 3 4 Math I, 2, and 3 OR Algebra 1, Geometry, and Algebra 2
- D. SCIENCE 1 2 3 Provides fundamental knowledge in 2 of following: Biology, Chemistry, Physics
- E. WORLD LANGUAGE 10 2 3 2 years must be same language
- F. VISUAL/PERFORMING ART 1 Must be same course/discipline
- G. COLLEGE PREP ELECTIVE 1

 Either "G" Elective or course in addition to required "A-F" course

SAT/ACT

UC/CSU will not consider SAT or ACT test scores when making admissions decisions or awarding scholarships.

Many Private/out-of-state schools have adopted a test-optional policy with few still requiring the exam



Most affordable option

Great option for students who are undecided on their major/career interests.

IVC and Saddleback have excellent transfer rates to 4-year universities

Transfer Admission Guarantee (TAG) Program allows guaranteed transfer for community college students who meet GPA requirements to 6 of 9 UC schools





Academic Focus: practical and careerfocused

Several campuses (i.e. CSU Channel Islands) are not impacted, which means that students who are A-G eligible and meet the 2.5 minimum GPA will be accepted.

More affordable tuition compared to the **UC System**

TIPS FOR PARENTS

Academic Focus: research-oriented

Learners will need a 3.0 GPA or higher to be eligible to apply

With the UC's holistic review of their applications and removal of SAT/ACT, learners will need to focus on more than just their GPA. Their extracurriculars take on more importance!

PRIVATE/OUT-OF-STATE TIPS FOR PARENTS

Financial aid (institutional grants, scholarships) can help offset out-of-state private school tuition.

Going to school out-of-state offers your learner an excellent opportunity to gain independence and maturity

Important for learners to build relationships with their teachers and counselors now, as many colleges request letters of recommendation.






10th Grade Classroom Lessons

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




