Earning High School Credits

A learner taking 6 classes per year...

6 classes X 5 credits per semester 2 semesters X 30 credits per semester 60 credits X 4 years









Official Transcripts

The only grades that will count on your official transcript are your semester grades (January, June) and Summer School (if applicable)

All grades will appear on your transcript, even if you repeat for a better grade!



Does my child need to take a 7th or 8th class?

- NO! Taking and passing 6 classes per year will allow your child to receive credits above and beyond what is needed to meet graduation requirements and 4-year college eligibility!
- → Consider taking 7 or 8 classes only if the classes align with your child's genuine interests
- → There are plenty of opportunities for your child to fulfill his/her visual/performing arts requirement his/her junior/senior year

Academic Eligibility for a UC/CSU School

Meet the A-G Requirements UC: GPA 3.0 or higher CSU: 2.0 or higher



A-G REQUIREMENTS CSU

Learners must complete the following requirements with a "C-" or higher

A. HISTORY 1 2 1/2 year US History, 1 year US History OR 1/2 year US History and 1/2 year Government

UC will not consider SAT or ACT test scores when making admissions decisions or awarding scholarships.

CSU

Continue to temporarily suspend the ACT/SAT exam in determining admission eligibility

Many Private/out-of-state schools have adopted a test-optional policy with few still requiring the exam
