STEP 2

ALL CALLS AND TIPS SENT TO 24/7
MULTILINGUAL CRISIS CENTER

- A Crisis counselor receives and reviews tip information
- The tip is triaged and categorized as either Life Safety or Non-Life Safety
- The tip is then sent to school officials and law enforcement (as needed) via text, email and phone call within seconds of being received

STEP 3

SCHOOL OFFICIALS & LAW ENFORCEMENT INTERVENE AND HELP INDIVIDUAL(S)

- School Officials and law enforcement (as needed) act immediately to investigate, assess and intervene on reported at-risk individuals
- The at-risk individual receives the help he or she needs BEFORE they ever get to the point of hurting themselves or others
- School officials report their outcomes into the SS-ARS platform and close out the tip ensuring accountability for every tip submitted



Counselor Availability

Counselors are available for students on a walk-in basis before/after school, during breaks and lunch!

Counselors are also available via email!



Transition to High School

Expectations are higher:

- Course material is more challenging and students have to work harder for A's.
- If students do not complete their homework and have low test scores, they will earn a D or an F (F receives no credit).
- If your student does not have homework for a few days... <u>SOMETHING IS WRONG.</u>
- Students are encouraged to take more initiative and more responsibility by prioritizing their commitments and asking for help

Advisement


Occurs on Wednesdays from 10:10-10:40 AM, students are with their same grade level peers and advisement teachers all four years.

Official Transcripts

The only grades that will count on your official transcript are your semester grades (January, June) and Summer School (if applicable)

All grades will appear on your transcript, even if you repeat for a better grade!



Does my child need to take a 7th or 8th class?



- → NO! Taking and passing 6 classes per year will allow your child to receive credits above and beyond what is needed to meet graduation requirements and 4-year college eligibility!
- → Consider taking 7 or 8 classes only if the classes align with your child's genuine interests
- → There are plenty of opportunities for your child to fulfill his/her visual/performing arts requirement his/her junior/senior year



A-G REQUIREMENTS CSU

Learners must complete the following requirements with a "C-" or higher

- A. HISTORY 1 2 1 year World History, 1 year US History OR 1/2 year US History and 1/2 year Government
- B. ENGLISH 1 2 3 4 4 Years of College Prep English
- C. MATH 1 2 3 4 Math I, 2, and 3 OR Algebra 1, Geometry, and Algebra 2
- D. SCIENCE 1 2 3 Provides fundamental knowledge in 2 of following:
 Biology, Chemistry, Physics
- E. WORLD LANGUAGE 1 2 3 2 years must be same language
- F. VISUAL/PERFORMING ART 1 Must be same course/discipline
- G. COLLEGE PREP ELECTIVE 1 Either "G" Elective or course in addition to required "A-F" course


Community Service Hours



 Posted on *Parent Portal* 4 times a year for students earning a C- or lower

FAQ #2: What if my child is doing poorly in class?

- Communicate with your student to discover the root of the problem (e.g., study habits, motivation, deficits)
- If additional academic help is needed, encourage your student to utilize PHS Academic Support Resources
 - Report to teachers' classrooms for Office Hours
 - Paper.co 24/7 online tutoring (links found in Google Classroom)
- Contact the teacher directly (email)
- If problems persist and/or personal social problems exist, contact the counselor and utilize personal and social resources


