- We are on the 6th year of our 6 year WASC plan, visitor coming in February and the plan will be edited for the following WASC cycle

- V. School Safety Plan Approval John
 - a. PHS School Safety Plan. The main updates for this year are:
 - Every school required to have a safety plan
 - Plan is unique to Portola High School
 - Available to the general public, accessible online and hard copy
 - There is a push for improved cellular reception on campus
 - Staff members' jobs for Search and Rescue will be reorganized due to new classroom openings and shifts
 - i. Part 1: Signature Page
 - ii. Part 3: Incident Command Chart
 - Required to have signs throughout campus pointing to AED PHS has 5 AEDs already
 - Suggestion: request for an additional AED in the Student Union
 - iii. Part 11: Student Discipline Crime Statistics
 - Numbers are relatively low
 - Students are concerned about each other and often communicate worries with staff members

- PHS attempts to not suspend students unless extremely necessary

VI. WASC - Year 6 - John

- This plan is designed to be more efficient and relevant (less categories, less days, etc)
- Gives input on where the school will go in the next WASC cycle/few years to staff, students, etc

VII. Data Review - John

- a. School Profile
 - Updated every year with info specific to that graduating class
 - Provided to colleges along with student transcripts to ensure that students are judged according to availability and environment on campus
 - Students are encouraged to balance APs, regular classes, etc feel pressure from self, peers, parents, etc to overload themselves
- b. Annual Survey Summary (PHS)
 - Receives participation from students, staff, and parents
 - PHS is ranked in top 5% of schools academically, in the middle of IUSD schools
 - Received high numbers saying there is an inclusive environment on campus
 - Attempting to ease academic pressure and student mental health/wellbeing
 - Working to convert a room to a mental health area
 - Every teacher is writing goals around equity and inclusion
- c. Other types/sources of data used throughout the year include:
 - i. Panorama, D/F, Skills/Learner Outcome, Equal Opportunity Schools, Classroom
 - Executive summary of survey/form responses provided by Mr Pehrson and the company that provides it (currently Thought Exchange for Annual Survey)
 - Surveys include those provided to sophomores and seniors to track progress, encourage students to try AP classes, classroom data, etc

VIII. Start of the Year Update - John

- a. Enrollment
 - PHS is currently at 2815 students, continuously growing throughout year
 - Biggest, most diverse, and most languages spoken school in the district
 - New staff member who will translate meetings, notes, etc to Mandarin
 - There is work to reorganize borders, students will be moved from Portola High School to Irvine High School since IHS is currently on a decline
 - PHS growth is predicted to increase for the next 6 years, then declining to average at around 2600

b. Construction

- New 1700s building with 16 classrooms will be the biggest one on campus
 - Plan to be ready for student use starting semester 2 construction team's deadline is winter break
 - Teachers will have 2 paid days to move classrooms
 - Progress check: has drywall inside, stucco, on good track
 - New umbrellas, tables, etc to make this area available for students
- VAPA portables will be gone pretty immediately once new building finishes
 - currently taking 30 parking spots
