Election Structure

The Freshmen Election

- 1. Candidates running for Freshman Representative will film a 45 second speech.
- 2. All freshmen will view candidate speeches during advisement (9/14) and vote for their preferred candidate.

Election Rules

- 1. The election packet and hard copy of your typed speech must be turned into the ASB office no later than Thursday September 6th by 3:30 p.m. and must be signed and verified that it is complete, not just dropped off.
- 2. Students must be in good academic standing with at least a 2.0 GPA and demonstrate good citizenship in all classes and extracurricular activities.

Campaigning and Promotional Material

- 3. All posters, flyers and other physical campaign materials must be approved by the ASB Directors in the ASB room starting at **7:30 AM on September 10th**
 - a. 2 Posters (22in. by 28in.) are allowed per candidate. These posters can only be taped on the 600, 700 and 800 buildings. Only painter's (masking) tape is to be used.
 - b. 20 flyers (8.5in. By 11in.) are allowed per candidate, and must be stapled to the purple bulletin boards around the school.
- 4. Candidates are not allowed to engage in negative campaigning
- 5. You are **NOT** allowed to pass out CANDY or FLYERS during campaign week.
- 6. Only candidates may wear any promotional material (i.e. T-shirts).
- 7. All election material must be removed and disposed of appropriately by 3:30 on September 14th. Failure to do so may result in candidate disqualification.
- 8. No obscene language or inappropriate conduct may be in speeches or campaign material
- 9. No student other than yourself may be used in your speech.
- 10. All props must be approved by Ms. Dean or Ms. Sheridan when speech is due.
- 11. No live animals may be used in the speech.
