Position Title

Freshman President

The Freshman President represents the interests and opinions of the PHS Freshman class. S/he works with the Freshman Vice President and Student Representative to collect feedback from the freshman class.

Freshman Vice President

The Freshman Vice President assists the Freshman President with his/her tasks, and is responsible for ensuring that the freshmen's opinions and feedback is heard and implemented in future ASB events.

The option of running with a partner as a pair is allowed. However, on election day, every candidate's name will be **individually listed.

For example: Sally and Parker are campaigning together. Their promotional material has both of their faces, and reads "Vote for Sally for Freshman President and Parker for Freshman VP!" When students are voting, Sally will be separately listed from Parker. There will be no "combined" option for Sally and Parker.

Election Rules

- 1. You must attend the Zoom Information meeting on Thursday, August 27th.
- 2. The *Freshman Pres/VP Candidate* Google Form must be submitted no later than 3:00 P.M. on Friday, August 28th. This includes a typed copy of your speech.
- 3. You must turn in your recorded video speech by Monday, August 31st by 11:59 P.M.
 - a. Video restrictions:
 - i. No longer than 30 seconds
 - ii. You must be the only person in the video
 - iii. No dress code violations and props must be approved beforehand
 - iv. Record the video in landscape and from your belly-button up.
- 4. Students must be in good academic standing with at least a 2.0 GPA and demonstrate good citizenship in all classes and extracurricular activities.

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Campaigning and Promotional Material

- 5. All promotional material can be posted on any Social Media platform, as long as it is:
 - a. School appropriate
 - i. No obscene language may be in speeches or campaign material, nor may there be any inappropriate conduct in the speech.
 - b. Promotes school spirit
- 6. Campaigning/promotion done through Social Media may not begin before 7AM on September 8.
 - a. This means no Instagram stories or posts before then.
- 7. Keep all promotional expenses under \$50.
- 8. All materials for campaigning must be supplied by the candidate.
- 9. Candidates are not allowed to engage in negative campaigning of any kind.
- 10. You cannot give away anything to the audience during your speech or campaign.
- 11. No student other than yourself may be used in your speech.
- 12. All props must be approved by Mrs. Alewine or Ms. Sheridan when speech is due.
- 13. No live animals may be used in the speech.

Failure to abide by these guidelines will result in **IMMEDIATE DISQUALIFICATION** of the candidate and possibly administrative referral.
