ABOUT PHS SOCIAL STUDIES ELECTIVES

Portola High School offers more Social Studies elective courses than any other high school in IUSD. Rather than waiting until college to be exposed to the range and diversity of subjects that the social studies field has to offer, PHS learners are encouraged to take advantage of our course offerings and enroll in one or more of our semester and/or yearlong electives.

WHO CAN TAKE A PHS SOCIAL STUDIES ELECTIVE?

All PHS learners in 11th and 12th grade are welcome to take a Social Studies elective course (with the exception of AP Human Geography, which is also open to 10th graders). While it is strongly recommended that students earn their most recent Social Studies teacher's recommendation to take an Honors or AP elective course, it is not required.

FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

Q: Should I take a CP, Honors, or AP Social Studies class?

A: There is a stark difference between the rigor and expectations in a CP (College Prep) course versus an Honors/AP course. Q: If I sign up for an Honors or AP course and decide it is not right for me, can I drop it?

 \mathcal{A} : No, you cannot drop an Honors or AP course once the school year starts. For yearlong courses, there is a possibility that you may drop out of the course after 1st semester ends, but there is no guarantee.
